



**San Diego County Fair (Recap)** by Linda Holst, Rancho Linda Marchadores

Theme *'Let's go to the show'*. Great Job to the team in California to Linda Holst and Daniel Pulliam with (Rancho Linda Marchadores) and many volunteers who gave up their time and energy to help support showing the Marchador breed. We thank you Linda and Daniel from our Marchador Family to yours. Keep up the great work and "keep on showing" Here is a brief summary on the success that was displayed at the fair from Linda Holst.



This year's San Diego County Fair held June 8-July 4th (Del Mar Fairgrounds) had a robust attendance following the "California Covid-19 Shut Down" of the entire state in 2020 and a much smaller fair in 2021. The average reported attendance in 2019 was 1.5 million over 27 days. This year 973,000 visitors attended a shortened Fair over 21 days. Without prior planning, Daniel Pulliam received a call from Southern California Horseman's Council.

The crowds were totally mesmerized! Thousands of people passed through the barn to view the equine exhibit and we had approximately a thousand people spend time watching the Marchador demonstrations over the weeks' time. Most of the public had not been close to horses and knew very little about them.



Rancho Linda Marchadores feels honored to have had the opportunity to showcase our wonderful breed !In fact, we couldn't believe how well Ariana Do Rancho Linda Marchadores and Janela Da Gameleira Soberana handled their new environment and patiently let crowds of people touch their faces while standing for photos. Both of the mares were total super stars, amazing during the entire six days of staying overnight, and being away from home! Ariana got a little needy for Janela, but



together they performed beautifully in the riding class demonstrations. Linda Holst manned the exhibit and narrated information about the breed. Daniel and another trainer announced and directed the show class demonstrations as the instructor/trainer. Most of all, we had four wonderful riders who had shown experience including two teens who devoted hours to making the exhibit of Mangalarga Marchadors successful. The trainer and her student riders had no prior knowledge of this breed so it was their professionalism and riding skills that made our exhibit time successful!

### **July 4th Parade**

Nice work to Alessandra Deerinck riding Aria de los Cielos as well as Daniel Pulliam riding Janela da Gameleira Soberana for showing their Marchadors at the July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade. Always-nice seeing Marchador's calm temperament in a parade setting. Always a big thank you to all in California who have so many opportunities to show the Marchador Breed.

### September 9-11. Labor Day Classic 2022 by Linda Holst, Rancho Linda Marchadores

The Southern California Horsemen's Council (SCHC) is hosting their 2022 Labor Day Classic all-breed horse show at a new venue. It will be held on **September 9-11 at the Oaks Blenheim, San Juan Capistrano (Orange County), CA**. Blenheim Equisports hosts 15 world-class horse shows at this prestigious riding park. Multiple breeds that are primarily gaited will be showing in the all-breed classes and their respective breed classes.

Beginning with the 2021 September Labor Day Classic and Jingle Bell in December, our Marchador horses have been gaining public experience in a show setting as well as advancing us as a group of Marchador owners. Everyone is welcome and each person that attends is valued and needed to support these types of events in order to grow breed awareness.

"We expect an affluent crowd from surrounding Southern California as onlookers and horses coming as far away as Kentucky and Florida to compete in their breed classes at this show", says Linda Holst, Rancho Linda Marchadores. "Beginning last September, none of our horses had any show experience. More experience came in December and Daniel Pulliam and I couldn't be prouder of each of the 21 horses that came to the show. It builds their skills at every level and makes a difference in their demeanor and their ability to respond in an appropriate manner to a variety of unexpected situations. The support of Marchador owners was amazing!"

The PR value for the Mangalarga Marchador breed in 2022 is expanding upon the recent exposure of Marchador horses and owners being featured on the covers of three magazines (Alessandra Deerinck, Tia Nelson, Daniel Pulliam), exhibiting the breed at the San Diego County Fair (Daniel Pulliam, Linda Holst) in June and participation in endurance rides (Tia Nelson), parades (Alessandra Deerinck) and a variety of competition events (Randy Gassett). United participation from Marchador owners in any of these shows creates immense potential for all USMMA members and breeders.



Plans are underway for Mangalarga Marchadors to participate in this All-Breed Show with participating horses presented by Rancho Linda Marchadores, CC Bellandi Marchadors, High Country Marchadors and Rancho De Los Cielos. ### Memorial - Bossa Nova de Miami

Bossa Nova de Miami started my whole journey with Mangalarga Marchadors. She is gone now to greener pastures, buried on a friend's property next to her sister's orphan foal overlooking the Blanco River in Pagosa Springs. But what a life we lived together.

We were partners for 21 years, and I will forever wish it could have been longer. We had many firsts together in the early years. She was my first Marchador; my first mare; and my first gaited horse. She was the first Marchador (we think) in endurance, short-lived as she thought it too much work. Bossa Nova was the first Marchador inspected and branded by the ABCCMM (Brazilian registry) in the U.S. Dr. Jose Eduardo Teves and Dr. Getulio Viera traveling to us at our Scottsdale Ranch. I remember building a fire for the branding iron and then running to the refrigerator for lemons for the branded area, as they wanted to follow "tradition" to mark the occasion. It took many years and hours at the ABCCMM registry office to get the paperwork in order for this to happen, but we felt it was worth it. She was definitely worth it.



We rode together in the 2002 Rose Bowl Parade, probably against all wisdom as it was the first parade we had ever done. She was not yet 4 years old. She did really well, reacting only once to a place where the pavement changed to brick.


Bossa Nova was smooth to ride and smart, so often she won for a rider that just stayed on as Bossa Nova did the pattern or the obstacle. She gave everyone confidence that rode her and I trusted her to keep my family safe - as they all rode her when they came to visit.



She was uncanny at remembering directions (something I am not good at). She always knew where the trailer was parked. One time when John and I were riding fast down a wash, she took a left that I didn't even know was there. John thought I disappeared! And what do you know, it was a new trail, and a shorter way home.

Bossa Nova was the matriarch of the Summerwind herd. She was the protector of me and of the other horses. One time in Colorado, 2 workers jumped the fence to take a short-cut through her pasture. But they failed to notice that her sister Chanel de Miami was in there as well with a new foal, Caesar do Summerwind. Never in my life did I see Bossa Nova rear up, but she did at those men and then chased them over the fence!

In her later years, she was no longer as capable, but everyone deferred to her still. Brasilia do Summerwind, younger and stronger and just as dominant, could have challenged her leadership, but it never happened. There was honor and deference within the group. Her wisdom and experience earned her that.

To say we will miss her is an understatement. It is difficult to look at photos and remember being young together, riding wild and free and loving every minute.
